Global Village is a new Global Citizenship Education (GCE) programme for primary schools in Ireland. It aims to support primary school pupils to become active global citizens committed to building a fairer and more sustainable world.

Through our engagement with teachers and school communities, Global Village is working to increase the reach, quality, accessibility, and effectiveness of GCE in the primary education sector. Global Village is currently in its pilot phase, a 20-month pilot programme running until July 2023. The pilot programme focuses on research, learning and establishing connections with key stakeholders in the GCE and Primary Education sectors.
