Teaching in the Republic of Ireland

Did you qualify as a teacher in Northern Ireland and now want to work in the Republic of Ireland (ROI)? This INTO guide explains the process.

Register with the Teaching Council (ROI)

To be eligible to work in ROI, you must register with the Teaching Council. You need documentation including copies of your exam transcripts, evidence of your teaching experience, a character reference and a statement of recognition from a recognised teaching authority.

- 1. On www.teachingcouncil.ie, set up a MyRegistration account and log on.
- 2. Complete one of the following options:

Primary teachers - Route 1

- Fill in the PRQA-01 online application form. Post-primary teachers Route 2
- Fill in the **PPQA-01** online application form.
- 3. Apply for a **vetting disclosure** as part of the online application. Only vetting through the Teaching Council is accepted. The National Vetting Bureau (NVB) will send your application to the PSNI for clearance. If you have lived abroad for one year or more cumulatively, you require police clearance from that country.
- 4. Pay the registration fee of €90.

Applications take up to 12 weeks from when you have submitted all the required documentation. You may receive a **Conditional Registration** and be required to take further steps to complete your registration. Find more information at **bit.ly/TeachingCouncilRegistration**

Apply for a PPSN

To access social welfare benefits, public services and information, you need a Personal Public Service Number (PPSN). To apply, complete the REG 1 application form at bit.ly/GetaPPSN

Revenue

As soon as you start working, sign up to www.revenue.ie to ensure that you do not pay emergency tax.

Droichead

If you have not completed a recognised induction period, you will be required to undertake the integrated induction

framework, Droichead, as part of your registration. Find more information at bit.ly/InductionDroichead

Primary teachers - Irish language requirement

If you do not have an Irish language qualification, you must complete an aptitude or adaptation test to prove you are competent to teach the Irish language.

After you receive a conditional registration, you will have three years to complete the test. During this time, you can work at the qualified rate of pay.

You do not have to complete the test if you obtained the Irish medium PGCE or B.Ed from St Mary's University College Belfast. Find more information at www.ilrweb.ie
